Event Description

The workshop will be used to involve current members in the strategic planning of the UK LOCKSS Alliance from now until 2013, and to update members on recent technical developments and progress with publishers.

1. In February 2011, a Strategic Plan for the UK LOCKSS Alliance was published on the new UKLA website. This highlights the strategic goals of the UKLA as to:
 - a. Identify, negotiate and make available for preservation a collection of journal titles relevant to need;
 - b. Increase usefulness and relevance of the UK LOCKSS Alliance community activity;
 - c. Sustain and develop a well-founded UK national co-operative library organisation to assist with ensuring continuing access to scholarly material.
2. The first half of the workshop will give an example of an institutional approach to journal preservation, and then consider what is happening at the national level. The purpose is to:
 - a. Review and update progress against the Strategic Plan.
 - b. Identify key risks and opportunities between now and July 2013 and discuss how to manage them.
 - c. Identify performance indicators between now and July 2013.
 - d. Seek recommendations for revisions to the Strategic Plan.
3. The second half of the workshop will update attendees on the current status with publisher negotiations and technical developments. The purpose is to:
 - a. Ensure members stay informed with regards to recent activity, and to highlight new functionality such as the integration of LOCKSS with Link Resolvers.
4. Finally, members will be given an opportunity to ask support staff questions about the administration and operation of their LOCKSS box.
