## News and Events

A joint breakout session to discuss the UK LOCKSS Alliance and the Keepers Registry has been accepted for the UKSG Conference 2013. Adam Rusbridge will present on behalf of the UK LOCKSS Alliance, and Fred Guy (Keepers Registry project manager) will present on behalf of the Keepers Registry.

The next meeting of the UK LOCKSS Alliance Steering Committee has been scheduled for the 26th November. Following the event, minutes will be made available on the UK LOCKSS Alliance website.

## System Development

We'd like to introduce a new developer at EDINA, Richard Wincewicz, who will be contributing to enhancements to the user interface developments previously outlined at <http://bit.ly/JadwGi>.

Version 1.57.4 of the LOCKSS software is now available. Release notes are available online at <http://bit.ly/OqSHcT>. Guidance on updating your LOCKSS box can be found at <http://bit.ly/uBNj9d>.

At the UKLA Members' Meeting in May 2012, several technical questions were asked:

**Q.** Will Shibboleth support be implemented to support off-site access to content?

**A.** The LOCKSS program has received funding from the Mellon Foundation which includes provision of Shibboleth authentication. This is due by the end of Q1 2014.

**Q.** It would be helpful to produce statistics on items served internally from a LOCKSS box, for example a JR/1 report showing monthly requests for each title. Is this planned?

**A.** Developers at Stanford are currently implementing a feature to generate COUNTER reports on the content served by a LOCKSS box.

**Q.** How frequently do Ex Libris collect updates from LOCKSS?

**A.** Our understanding is that Ex Libris collect updates from LOCKSS on a monthly basis.

**Q.** Will the Ex Libris integration continue to work with Alma?

**A.** Yes, we believe so. If you're planning to transition, please get in touch.

**Q.** Integration with Innovative WebBridge is a priority for a number of UK institutions. When will this be made available?

**A.** Innovative Interfaces have implemented the necessary functionality to integrate WebBridge with LOCKSS. Documentation to assist with integration will be made available in the near future.
