EDINA hosted a small event at this year's UKSG conference on Tuesday 27th March. Around 15 people attended the event, where Adam Rusbridge gave a short introduction to the UK LOCKSS Alliance (highlighting the post-cancellation access provided through link resolver integration), and Fred Guy introduced the Keepers Registry. The event was a welcome opportunity to promote LOCKSS to new UK institutions.

## Content Development

During March, 4,823 additional archival units were made available for preservation (22 new publishers, 935 new titles) including Taylor and Francis. So far during April, 1,822 additional archival units have been made available for preservation in the Global LOCKSS Network (GLN), including archival units from 2 new publishers and 39 new titles. The Stanford LOCKSS team has introduced new internal tools to simplify the content release workflow, increasing the number of team members who can undertake this process.
